

Implementation of the Japan-India Bilateral Fighter Jet Exercise

From January 16 to 26, Koku-Jieitai (Japan Air Self-Defense Force) conducted the Japan-India bilateral fighter exercise. This is the first bilateral fighter exercise between the two air forces conducted in Japan, which was agreed at the Japan-India 2+2 meeting and the Joint Statement. The purpose of the exercise was to enhance Koku-Jieitai's tactical skills, promote mutual understanding between the two air forces, and further deepen defense cooperation. The realization of the first bilateral fighter exercise in the 70th anniversary of the establishment of Japan-India diplomatic relations is significant.

Koku-Jieitai will continue to promote defense cooperation and exchanges between Koku-Jieitai and Indian Air Force, contributing to upholding and reinforcing Free and Open Indo-Pacific(FOIP) and the regional peace and stability.
