Chief of Staff, Joint Staff, visited U.S. Indo-Pacific Command

On 24th April (HST), General Yamazaki, Chief of Staff, Joint Staff, visited Camp H. M. Smith, HI, and had a bilateral meeting with Admiral Davidson, Commander, United States Indo-Pacific Command (USINDOPACOM).

During the meeting, the two leaders discussed a broad range of the current security environment in the Indo-Pacific region and reaffirmed that the ironclad alliance between Japan and the United States fulfills not only a critical role for Japan's national defense, but also a cornerstone of peace, security and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region and even the international arena. Both leaders shared the vision to strengthen and extend their ties and cooperation in various fields to realize a free and open Indo-Pacific while affirming their continued effort to further build-up the deterrence and response capabilities.

Subsequently, General Yamazaki had meetings with Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet, Admiral Aquilino and Commander, U.S. Marine Corps Forces, Pacific, Lieutenant General Craparotta.
