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Japan-US Bilateral Joint Exercise "Keen Sword 21 (FTX)"

Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) and U.S. Forces will conduct a bilateral field exercise "Keen Sword 21" as follows.

This exercise, based on ironclad Japan-U.S. relationship, aims to ensure the combat readiness and enhance interoperability of both forces through various trainings. The JSDF and U.S. Forces are maintaining necessary posture and capability to contribute to peace and stability in the region by conducting exercises like Keen Sword.

JSDF will conduct an exercise on SDF joint operation and Japan-US bilateral response to improve SDF combat readiness and Japan-U.S. interoperability.

- Japan-U.S. Bilateral Joint Exercise began in FY 1985. Since then, JSDF and U.S. Forces have been holding the exercise annually with few exceptions (FTX and CPX alternately). KS21 marks 15th FTX.

Canada, Australia, India, the Philippines, and the Republic of Korea to observe the exercise.
